# Rabbi Emerita Rabbi Judith HaLevy

This is the season when we call on light to illuminate the darkness. Here in Santa Fe, roofs are lined with "luminarias", candles held in small containers that glow. Native Americans celebrate this time with bonfires. The Jewish tradition, however, is not only about light, but miracles.

We know the story. When rededicating our Holy Temple, the Maccabees had to relight the Menorah, but they only had enough pure olive oil to last for one day. Miraculously, the oil burned for eight days. The great rabbinic authority Joseph Caro asks, if Chanukah is about a miracle, and the oil which was only supposed to last one day lasted eight, then why don't we celebrate Chanukah for seven days? After all, the first day of the oil burning was no miracle! The greatest miracle was the resolution to rededicate, to clean up and start over again.

These last Covid years have been challenging. How do we provide a High Holiday service when access to our "Holy Temple" is restricted by recurring illness? How do we keep the light of Torah study burning? How can we keep our sense of community alive when we are separated by darkness?

Chanukah literally means "rededication". Yes, zoom is a modern miracle, but the real miracle of Chanukah has been our rededication to our own holy temple. Faced with plague and fire, we rededicated ourselves to "cleaning up the mess" and starting over. We learned how to share the light of Shabbat even when physically separated. We never let the light of Torah go out. We continued to celebrate and to even to mourn as community. The coming year will bring additional challenges, as we begin the process of building a new intimate sanctuary and a state-of-the art pre-school, but we have rededicated ourselves to making our vision manifest. It is a miracle.

On each night of Chanukah, we declare

She-asah nisim la-avoteinu ba- yamim ha-heim ba-z' man ha-zeh.

Who did miracles for our forefathers and foremothers, in former times and in our own time.

### Rabbi Bill Kaplan

Many of you have met Rabbi Bill Kaplan at Shabbat on the Beach, at High Holy Day services, on a Zoom Shabbat, at a bar or bat mitzvah, or at religious school. Rabbi Bill is not new to MJCS as he helped at the end of 2017 and into 2018 when Rabbi Emerita Judith left for Santa Fe by leading the Torah class monthly,

teaching the 7th grade class at the religious school, officiating bar and bat mitzvahs, and leading monthly Shabbat services with Rabbi Cantor Marcelo. He returned to MJCS on a part-time basis in June 2021 to partner with Rabbi Cantor Marcelo to lead Friday night Shabbat services including Shabbat on the Beach, High Holy Days and other special holiday services and programs, and bar and bat mitzvahs. Rabbi Bill also once again is teaching the 7th grade class at the religious school. In 2023, he will also be teaching some adult education courses like he did in 2017-18.

So, who is Rabbi Bill?

When Rabbi Bill is not at MJCS, he is the CEO of Shalom Institute (www.shalominstitute.com), a year-round experiential Jewish and environmental education center. Rabbi Bill just completed his 32nd year with Shalom Institute. Shalom Institute is a hub of Jewish life in Southern California. Shalom Institute's diverse programs include Camp JCA Shalom, a Jewish Community Center residential summer camp for youth, Camp JCA Shalom Day Camp in West Hills, Camp Gesher, the North American overnight camp for Russian-speaking Jewish children and families; Sherut L'Olam, a community teen leadership and advocacy program with programs for both middle school and high school teens, environmental education, and Shemesh Farms, an employment initiative and social enterprise employing adults with special needs and diverse abilities, located right here at MJCS.

Rabbi Bill, as a Jewish educator, uses nature, organic gardens, and biblical gardens creatively to teach Torah, Israel, Jewish culture, holidays, Jewish environmental values, and Jewish history in a model he calls "Edible Judaism" (www.ediblejudaism.com). He will be doing some of his Edible Judaism programs for MJCS this coming year.

Rabbi Bill is a native of Los Angeles. He has a BA from Wesleyan University in Middletown, CT, an MBA in Non-Profit Management from American Jewish University, and his rabbinical ordination from the Academy For Jewish Religion in Los Angeles.

Rabbi Bill is married to Rachel. They have two children, Noah, 24, and Rebecca, 21, and a Havanese dog Tony, 10.

Ta' sh'ma -- Come and Learn!

Jews all over the world participate in the world's oldest and longest-running book club....and we read the same book every year. Our book, written in antiquity and studied by our ancestors for millennia encapsulates both the uniqueness of our Jewish tradition and encompasses the complexities of being human.

Truly, this book really is unique among all other books. According to one source of Jewish wisdom literature Pirke Avot ("Chapters of our Ancestors"), we should "turn it and turn it and turn it again...for everything is in it.

"Torah" means instruction, and Torah study is a continuing source of revelation, even astonishment; engaging with Torah is our birthright, our privilege and a source of inspiration. Studying Torah invites us to engage with our heritage, our history, our mythology, our psychology. It is a work of astonishing literary beauty. Its characters are compelling, its plot lines are timeless and its challenges are many.

Rabbi Akiva, who began to learn the Hebrew aleph-bet at the age of forty and grew into one of the greatest of our Sages opined, "If you learned Torah in your youth, learn it as an adult. Don't say, 'I won't learn Torah as an adult,' because you never know which period of learning will make a deeper impression, perhaps both will remain with you and even complement one another."

As Rabbi Akiva knew from his own life experience, it's never too late to learn; it's never too late to grow. The text remains the same; we do not. Torah study nurtures new ideas and insights. Come grow with us!

can use all or part of your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) up to \$100,000, to make a charitable gift to MJC&S. The entire amount of your gift passes to MJC&S and you pay no income tax on the money. If you intend to use your IRA to make a gift this year, we encourage you to make plans now. Please do not wait until the end of the year to arrange for your distribution as IRA administrators may take weeks to complete the transfer.
